The search

The Allen East Board of Education is seeking highly qualified applicants for the position of superintendent. The school board hopes to have a candidate selected in early March with an appointment coming at the March 17 meeting. The application deadline for this search is Friday, February 13. The successful candidate will take the place of retiring superintendent, Mel Rentschler.

Working in close collaboration with Treasurer Andrea Snyder, the superintendent serves as the district's chief academic leader and a key member of the leadership team. The superintendent is responsible for advancing the district's strategic plan, fostering a responsive and positive culture and climate, overseeing day-to-day operations, and effectively informing and educating the board of education and

the community about the district's current status and future direction.

The district

Covering the eastern half of Allen County, Allen East Local Schools serves approximately 1,100 students across grades PK-12 on a centralized campus that was built in 2007. The school district is focused on providing its students with the most preparation for after graduation through pathways that lead to them either being enrolled, employed or enlisted. The high school offers career-technical education opportunities in the areas of STEM and advanced manufacturing along with the opportunity for upperclassmen to attend Apollo Career Center to gain certifications in their desired field.

College Credit Plus courses are offered through the surrounding universities including Bluffton University, University of Northwestern Ohio (UNOH), Rhodes State College, Ohio Northern University and the Ohio State University at Lima. The high school's Future Farmers of America (FFA) chapter has been successful across all competitions including a staggering number of state awards. The program saw some of its students receive their American degree this past fall at national convention. The school district has an abundant offering of extracurriculars such as sports teams, Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD), foreign language clubs, performing and visual arts, student council and yearbook. A youth sports alliance is affiliated with the school district to ensure opportunities are provided for those in grades K-6.

Mission: Create a partnership with parents and members of the local community that provides a safe, positive, and academically challenging environment where students will become responsible, productive citizens of a society that values lifelong learning.

The community

Set against a rural, farming background in Northwest Ohio, Allen East Local Schools covers the eastern half of Allen County. The school district is surrounded by Interstate 75 and U.S. Route 30 leading to easy access from Lima, Findlay and Kenton. In addition, three villages are encompassed by the school district: Harrod, LaFayette and Westminster. The community has strong pride for its students and the school district holds a regular senior citizens Mustang Breakfast for residents over age 55 that includes student entertainment.

The community has an annual Pork Rind Festival in the Village of Harrod over the second weekend of June. Fireworks, a car show, beauty pageant organized by the Auglaize Township Historical Society, a craft show and parade take place over the two-day event. The annual Allen County Fair is held at the end of August where students across all grades participate and succeed in the fields of beef, swine, sheep, showmanship and fair royalty.

Furthermore, the new superintendent should be one who anticipates obtaining or presently holds a current license that is in good standing.

The new superintendent should be able to demonstrate or show evidence of accomplishment in the following areas:

- an ability to work tactfully, creatively and visibly with board members, administrators, staff, students, parents, community and elected officials
- a child-centered decision maker with a comprehensive view of education, a working knowledge of curriculum and instruction and commitment to the development of all children
- a sound fiscal manager who effectively balances legal, judicial and financial requirements of the district with the needs of the students and the desires of the community
- a creative thinker and innovator who has found ways to challenge the academic achievement of the system and is committed to the belief that all children can achieve at a high level
- abilities and strategies to improve district culture and morale
- an educational team leader able to develop, supervise and support teaching and administrative talent, who inspires high performance standards with accountability, and finds satisfaction in the success of others
- a person of integrity who has high standards of honesty, ethics and personal conduct
