## The search

The Mohawk Local Board of Education is searching for a district treasurer to become its new chief financial officer. It is anticipated that the new treasurer will begin their duties in July 2026. The school board hopes to have a candidate selected by the end of June. The application deadline is Friday, June 12.

As its financial leader, the position of treasurer is crucial to the district's leadership team. In collaboration with the superintendent, Andrew Sprang, the treasurer's role is to achieve the school district's fiscal goals, maintain financial policy, provide accurate and accountable records and preserve district stability by using sound personnel management practices. The treasurer is also

expected to educate and inform both the board of education and community with the current and future challenges of school funding.

The district's 871 students benefit from a strong academic concentration and focus on student achievement provided by a dedicated staff and administration. The district's emphasis on outstanding educational opportunities, combined with sound fiscal stewardship, leads to strong commitment by the board of education, students, parents and community.

With an average elementary class size of under 20 students, the district's primary goal is to ensure all students know and understand the district's learning expectations. The ability of each staff member to relay these expectations results in a positive learning environment.

The district and community have a strong commitment to the visual and performing arts and built a state-of-the-art performing center entirely with local funding. With active music and athletic booster groups, as well as an excellent FFA program, the district ensures students have a variety of extracurricular opportunities.

Mohawk students are able to take advantage of vocational education opportunities through the Vanguard-Sentinel Career and Technology Centers in nearby Tiffin. Juniors and seniors are offered College Credit Plus classes on campus through various regional colleges and universities. Students also take online and college campus courses with Heidelberg University, University of Findlay, Owens Community College, Terra State Community College and Rhodes State College.

The Mohawk Local School District in northwestern Ohio is located near the village of Sycamore, where the Mohawk Historical Society is extremely active in preserving the heritage of the school district and surrounding communities. ## Qualifications

The Mohawk Local Board of Education seeks a qualified school treasurer that demonstrates a thorough knowledge of and successful experience in sound fiscal management practices. The ideal candidate has a strong understanding of Ohio school law and public-school finance, the ability to serve as a contributing member of the management team and possesses the attitude of a self-starter who can work on multiple tasks simultaneously and organize information efficiently.

The successful candidate must hold a current and valid treasurer's license.

The new treasurer should be able to demonstrate or show evidence of accomplishment in the following areas:

- ability to work well and form a strong partnership with the superintendent
- excellent analytical, listening, verbal and written communication skills; someone who can frankly and diplomatically convey pertinent information to the board, superintendent, staff, community and news media
- ability to develop both short and long-range forecasts
- sophisticated business management skills in the areas of long-range planning, fiscal forecasting, personnel management, collective bargaining and insurance management
- positive personality with a high degree of integrity, enthusiasm, energy and dedication
- ability to maintain fiscal credibility and to serve as the board's spokesperson to communicate financial and management information to the management team and community
